### **Brown Act** Regulation Changes

### AB 2449 (RUBIO, 2022) **EXEMPTIONS**

Brown Act requires that all members of a legislative body to disclose their locations for each meeting and that their locations be open to the public. AB 2449 (Rubio, 2022) changed Government Code section 54953 to allow members to not disclose their location up to two times every calendar year if they meet the following exemptions:

- Physical or medical emergency
- Contagious Illness
- Caretaking or childcare
- Travel related to your SBA
- Physical or mental disability not already accommodated
